HCS is accredited to serve students in grades 3–12. Most students enroll in upper elementary school. The average length of stay is 3-4 years, but may be longer or shorter depending on a student's specific needs.

HCS's land is the heart of the school.

It is a source of recreation, renewal, and pride. HCS owns more than 1,700 acres, of which 1,400 acres are permanently preserved as the Wapack Wilderness, in partnership with the Northeast Wilderness Trust.

The property is comprised of hundreds of acres of forests, open fields, pastures, and wetlands. It features three ponds that range in size from a few acres to 39 acres. It includes the southern part of Barrett Mountain, including Pratt Peak and Stonytop.

types of farm animals



Students can obtain hands-on experience working on a functional, small-scale, sustainable farm.

This resource supplements and enhances curriculum and meals, by providing the school kitchen with the highest quality meat, eggs, and produce.

FARM LIFE & ANIMALS

Cattle, chickens, ducks, goats, pigs, rabbits, sheep, and turkeys live on the farm. Some students

take an interest in taking care of the animals or performing daily farm chores. Others simply enjoy the calming benefits of spending time with farm animals.

Teachers may coordinate academic lessons with the farm to provide opportunities for students to learn about business planning and management, environmental and veterinary science, mathematics, biology, anatomy, and chemistry.



WILDLIFE

In addition to the farm animals, the 1,700-acre property supports a large variety of wildlife, including beaver, deer, wild turkeys, moose, mink, otter, coyotes, bobcats, and many other birds, mammals, and reptiles.

The numerous lakes have an abundance of fish, including trout, pickerel, pike, and bass.
